## Logos International School Parent Quick-Guide

Welcome to Logos International School (LIS)! We are so glad to have you! We highly encourage you to read through the most recent LIS handbook, but until then, this quick-guide should get you started.

\*\* *LIS is a Christian educational institution* that utilizes the Bible as the cornerstone of its curriculum and as the foundation of the LIS community. Please be aware that your child(ren) will be taught from this perspective.

MISSION: Logos International School is dedicated to academic excellence in providing a well-rounded, quality, Christian education to students from all ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds. Upon graduation, students will be equipped to view all aspects of life from a biblical perspective, to serve and help transform their communities for Christ, and to pursue further education.

**VISION:** Every student is a spiritually maturing, academically equipped, and socially responsible individual.

MOTTO: A heart for Christ, for Truth, and for the World.

- \*\* Make sure the LIS office has your email address for the Wednesday Update. The Wednesday Update is the weekly email that communicates upcoming events, announcements from Administration, etc. Receiving this weekly email will keep you up to date on what is going on around LIS.
- \*\* As an LIS parent, you are automatically a part of Logos Parents Association (LPA). The goal of LPA is to support LIS Administration, teachers, and students. Be looking in the Wednesday Update for meeting dates, times, and specific ways to volunteer around campus! You may contact the LPA President with any questions at lpa@logoscambodia.org
- \*\* Monthly tuition payments are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> business day of each month.

  Payments after the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month will be assessed a 10% penalty fee. (See LIS Handbook for details.)
- \*\* *English is the language spoken on the LIS campus.* All instruction will be given in English. It is also expected that all students converse in English throughout the school day.
- \*\* As a Christian school, LIS holds regular chapel services for all grades. All students are required to attend and participate.
- \*\* Official LIS uniforms are required for all Kindergarten through Grade 12 students. Physical education uniforms are required for Pre-K 3&4 students. Uniforms can be purchased at LIS the week before school begins. The LIS administration office also has a limited stock of replacement uniforms available for purchase throughout the school year. (See LIS Handbook for details.)

#### PRE-KINDERGARTEN (Pre-K 3 & Pre-K 4)

<u>ALL</u>: Physical Education uniforms, required for Swim and PE days **ELEMENTARY (Grade K – 5):** 

<u>BOYS:</u> Light blue LIS uniform shirt. Beige or navy blue slacks or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

<u>GIRLS:</u> Light blue LIS uniform shirt. Beige or navy blue skirt, slacks, capris, or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

### MIDDLE SCHOOL (Grade 6 - 8):

<u>BOYS:</u> White or maroon LIS uniform shirt. Beige, black or navy blue slacks or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

<u>GIRLS:</u> White or maroon LIS uniform shirt. Beige, black or navy blue skirt, slacks, capris, or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

### HIGH SCHOOL (Grade 9 - 12):

<u>BOYS:</u> White or royal blue LIS uniform shirt. Beige, black or navy blue slacks or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

GIRLS: White or royal blue LIS uniform shirt. Beige, black or navy blue skirt, slacks, capris, or shorts (no extra pockets on the sides).

\*\*All skirts and shorts must be worn no shorter than two inches above the knee

# PHYSICAL EDUCATION (Grades Pre-K 3 – 12, BOYS & GIRLS):

An additional official LIS physical education uniform must also be purchased to be worn only during physical education class.

- \*\* Students may bring their own lunch or purchase lunch in the school cafeteria for an additional fee. (Contact LIS office for details.)
- \*\* **Health & Medication:** LIS employs a full-time nurse on campus. Please contact the nurse if your child(ren) require routine medications during the school day. LIS follows the 24 hour rule for fever, vomiting, and other spreadable symptoms. (See LIS Handbook for details.)
- \*\* Secondary Communication: Rosariosis, is a student information system that records attendance and grades. Parents are encouraged to create an account and access their children's grades. In order to set up an account, you may stop by the office or email Socheata at logosoffice@logoscambodia.org.
- \*\*Bring Your Own Device (BYOD): Grade 11-12: Laptops are required; Grade 9-10: Devices are required (laptops or tablets are preferred)
- \*\* Middle and High School students will be assigned a locker at the beginning of each school year. The students are required to provide their own combination lock. (See LIS Handbook for details.)
- \*\* Questions about grading, homework, graduation requirements, school discipline, behavior expectations, students' rights and responsibilities, visitors on campus, students' electronic devices, etc? (See LIS Handbook for details.)
